The weather is getting better, lets start bringing our wheels to school again on Mondays.



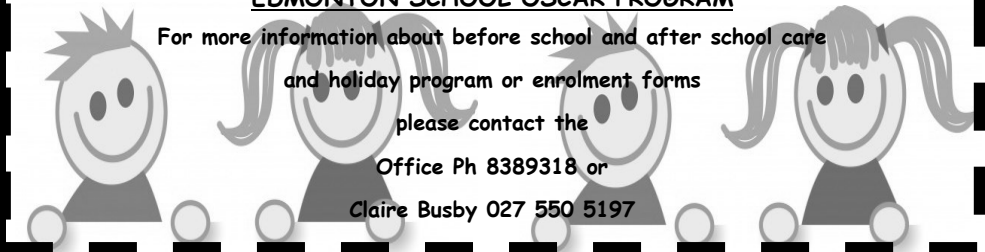

We are co-operative learners!

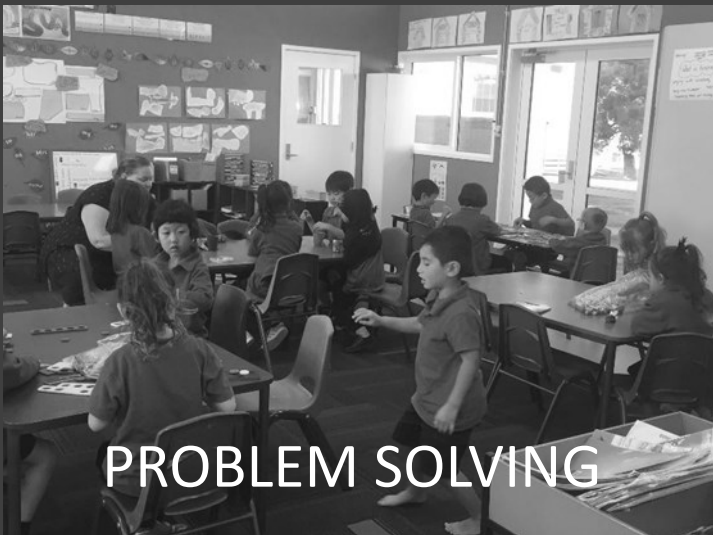
In Room 2 you will often find us working together in groups. Co-operative learning gives us the opportunity to work with our friends.

Through providing the tamariki with opportunities to learn alongside and with each other, we are developing skills for lifelong learning.

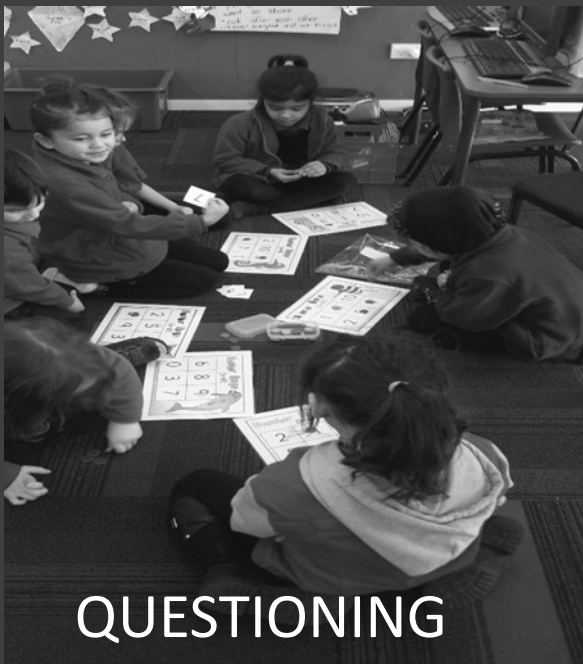


TAKING TURNS
