Tiger facts

1) Tigers are the largest wild cats in the world.

Adults can weigh up to **363kg** (that's about the same as *ten* ten year olds!) and measure up to **3.3m**!

2) Tigers are carnivores, eating only meat.

They mainly feed on large mammals such as deer, wild pigs, antelope and buffalo.

3) Tigers are solitary hunters, and generally search for food alone at night.

They **quietly stalk their prey** until they are close enough to pounce – then they kill their victim with a bite to the neck or back of the head. Ouch!

4) Tigers are good swimmers!

Unlike most members of the cat family, they like water and often **cool off in pools or streams**.

- 5) A tiger's roar can be heard as far as three kilometres away.
- SO when they want to be heard, you'll know about it, gang!
- 6) At full speed, tigers can reach up to 65km/h.

That's right – they may be big and heavy, but tigers are by no means slow movers!

7) These fierce felines have walked the earth for a long time.

Fossil remains of tigers found in parts of China are believed to be 2 million years old. Yikes!

8) No two tigers have the same stripes.

Since every tiger has their own pattern not only on their fur but their skin as well, they are all unique!

9) Today, there are five subspecies of tiger.

These subspecies are the **Bengal tiger**, **South China tiger**, **Indochinese tiger**, **Sumatran tiger** and **Amur tiger** (also known as Siberian tiger). Sadly, three subspecies of tiger have become extinct – the Caspian, Bali and Javan.

10) Less than 100 years ago, tigers could be found throughout Asia.

Sadly, hunting and habitat loss have put populations at risk, and today their range has been reduced to around **7% of its** former size. That's why we need to do all we can to protect these beautiful beasts!

Salt dough Easter egg decorations

Make these easy salt dough Easter eggs by mixing flour, salt and water, then stamping out the shapes with a biscuit cutter. Once baked, paint them with acrylic paints or try acrylic paint pouring. It's easy to do and the patterns will be different every time – just be sure to protect your surfaces first!



Takes 15 mins, plus baking time


To make salt dough Easter eggs, you will need:

Plain flourSaltWaterMixing bowlRolling pinBaking parchmentBaking trayBiscuit cutterAcrylic paintString

What to do

- 1. Heat the oven to 120° fan/gas 1.
- 2. Mix two parts plain flour with one part salt and one part water. Once the dough starts coming together, knead the mixture with your hands – if it feels a little sticky, sprinkle in a bit more flour, or add a splash more water if it's crumbly.
- **3.** Roll the dough out on a lightly floured work surface until it's 5mm-1cm thick. Use an oval biscuit cutter to stamp out as many egg shapes as you can. If you want to make hanging Easter eggs, poke a hole in the top using a skewer or the end of a straw.
- 4. Line a baking tray with baking parchment and arrange the salt dough eggs on top in a single layer. Bake for 2-3 hrs on the bottom shelf, or until the shapes are hard. Leave to cool completely.
- **5.** Pour over some acrylic paint, making sure to cover all the sides with colour, or paint normally. Leave to dry completely, then thread string through the hole at the top (if using) and secure with a knot before hanging.

Easter Egg Rice Bubble Nests







Ingredients

Butter, for greasing

Mars bars, chopped - 4

Unsalted butter, chopped - 100 g

Rice bubbles - 3 cups

Assorted mini chocolate Easter eggs

Method

Step 1

Grease and line 10 bases of a 12-hole muffin tin.

Step 2

Place Mars bars and butter in a medium saucepan. Stir over a low heat for 5 minutes or until melted.

Step 3

Place rice bubbles in a large heatproof bowl. Add melted Mars bar mixture and stir to combine. Allow to cool, then divide mixture among pan holes and shape into nests.

Step 4

Refrigerate until firm. Store in refrigerator until just before serving.

step 5

When ready to serve, place on a platter with Easter eggs arranged inside each nest.

Tip: If you have rice bubbles which have gone stale, toast them in the oven to freshen them up and make them crunchy again.




